| Curriculum Format | Each lesson can be presented in 45-60 minutes. Teaching Guide with complete instructions is provided. Teaching Kit with materials needed to present lessons is provided. | Lesson | Overview |

| One: Nature All Around | Students learn about the natural world and where to find it. Students will practice their skills of observation for both man-made items and natural objects. |
| Two: Carbon Footprint | Students will learn the definition of a carbon footprint. Then, they will do an activity to assess their carbon footprint, and ways they can reduce their own carbon footprint. |
| Three: Alternative Energy | Students will watch a DVD about alternative energy. After the DVD they will discuss ways they can use different sources of energy. Then, they will do an activity that includes making a solar oven to make a snack. |
| Four: Water Quality | Students will learn the importance of maintaining clean water. Then they will do an activity to test the quality of water using different samples. |
| Five: Recycling | Students will watch a DVD and learn the three R's of recycling. Then, they will do an activity to show the different ways to recycle. |
| Six: Eco-Friendly Living | Students will learn how to live a more environmentally friendly life. Then, they will do an activity that includes decorating their own reusable bag and making their own homemade all-purpose cleaner. |
