Pioneer Seed Grants for Iowa 4-H Club Community Improvement Projects

The objective of these grants is to stimulate local 4–H clubs in Iowa to plan and carry out community improvement activities by providing "seed money" needed to make the projects successful. Pioneer will provide up to \$5,000 to selected 4–H clubs in Iowa. Awards will be made directly to the clubs through the Iowa 4–H Foundation from Pioneer as soon as selections are made.

Grants will range from a minimum of \$50 to a maximum of \$500.



- Make check payable to ISU Scott County Extension Office.



Youth Well-Being

Goal Setting & Growth Mindset

Setting goals is a traditional way to begin the year and this process is related to growth mindset. Both are important parts of the 4–H Positive Youth Development model.

When children set goals, they develop self-knowledge such as awareness of their strengths, areas for improvement, and how to prioritize what is important to them. They learn decision-making skills, the importance of taking responsibility for their actions, and how to take an active role in building their future.

The SMART framework can help kids set their goals:

- S for specific-what, when, how, and why
- M for measurable- track your progress along the way
- A for achievable- it's challenging but can be accomplished
- R for realistic- try setting smaller goals that build toward a larger goal
- T for time- set a due date or time frame

How is growth mindset related to goal setting? The key word is "yet." If you have not achieved your goal yet, think about what you learned from the experience. Did you notice a way to break it down into more attainable steps. Do you need to set aside more time? The growth mindset response is to examine the process and keep working toward your goals.

If you did achieve your goal, the growth mindset response is to build on that achievement. Can you think of a longer-term goal? What is the next step in that process? Can you extend or condense the time frame? For example, if you succeeded in writing in a journal for 5 minutes a day for two weeks, try expanding the time frame to two months. You will continue to improve your self-reflection and writing skills and new goals may arise from there.
