COUNTY STATIC, PHOTOGRAPHY & HORTICULTURE:

Exhibitors are **REQUIRED** to enter all exhibits in Fair Entry by NOON the day prior to judging for that specific event. If entries are not made by NOON, the day prior *(See chart below), exhibitors will NOT be allowed to exhibit.

On Saturday, July 30th, Static Exhibit Check-in will take place in the IOWA BARN atrium (Dairy/Poultry barn). Check-in will begin at 7:45 a.m. Please come to the Iowa Barn to pick up your packet of entry materials.

Please come during your clubs allotted time to help minimize crowds in the 4-H building.

PHOTOGRAPHY:

ENTRY TAGS- Photography, Static Day, Horticulture:

Entry tags will be printed from fair entry this year. You will pick up all of your project entry tags during the checkin process for each event and attach them to your projects. Please give yourself a little extra time to prep your projects when you arrive at the fairgrounds, prior to being judged.

GROUP PROJECTS:

Groups will be judged in the age category of the oldest member. Members may submit projects done as a group. The project will be entered in the appropriate subject matter class and each member must be entered in the project via Fair Entry. All group members will be eligible for ribbons and premiums, but no trophies will be given.

Mystery Trip Recap

Scott County 4-H hosted a Mystery Trip for Intermediate and Senior 4-H members on June 9, 2022. 4-H youth from Muscatine and Clinton Counties were also invited to attend. Twenty-eight members representing all three counties came along for the adventure.

Just as the name of the event implies, participants were treated to a daylong excursion without knowing where they were going. A few days prior to the trip, parents attend a required meeting at which they were provided the day's itinerary with instructed not to share with their children. Departing on a charter bus from Eldridge at 7:15 a.m., the first stop was Four Mounds Inn & Conference Center, an outdoor recreational area in Dubuque. Four Mounds is home to high and low ropes courses and a rock climbing wall.

Youth practiced communication and leadership skills while taking part in lots of team building activities with staff from Team Building Blocks of Dubuque.





From there, the group traveled to the National Mississippi River Museum where a STEM program was presented on reptiles and amphibians followed by a self-guided tour. Crystal Lake Caves outside of Bellevue was the next destination. Youth received a guided tour of the cave and an educational presentation by their staff. Everyone enjoyed some social time while relaxing and playing UNO, bags, volleyball and soccer. The last stop was Off Shore Resort in Bellevue for a delicious dinner overlooking the Mississippi River. The trip concluded at 8:00 p.m.
