## **Scott County Information**

#### Information on fairbooks from Mississippi Valley Fair Grounds

The fairbooks are currently online and can be found <u>HERE</u>. If you would like to pick up a printed book fairbook, they will be available at the Mississippi Valley Fair Office (on the MVF fairgrounds) after June 15<sup>th</sup>. They are limiting the number to One per household and each family will have to go pick them up individually (per the fair office). If you would like additional books they will be \$5.

#### **FAIR ENTRY ONLINE**

#### **COUNTY FAIR LIVESTOCK:**

Fair Entry will be the only way to enter 4-H/FFA Livestock into the Mississippi Valley Fair again this year. The Entry Period will open on June 1<sup>st</sup> and Close on July 1<sup>st</sup> at 11:59 p.m. No Late Entries will be accepted. (Exception: Carcass Show- See Livestock changes in this document.) Entries will be made at <a href="http://mississippivalleyfair4h.fairentry.com">http://mississippivalleyfair4h.fairentry.com</a>. No stall or entry fees will be collected this year. If you are entering an animal into both county and state fair, please read the paragraph below.

#### STATE FAIR:

State Fair Livestock and Horticulture will again be done on Fair Entry. Horticulture entries are now open. Livestock entries will be open June 1<sup>st</sup> and close on July 1<sup>st</sup> at 11:59 p.m. No Late Entries will be accepted. Entries can be made by searching the 2022 lowa State Fair at: <a href="https://fairentry.com/Public/FindYourFair">https://fairentry.com/Public/FindYourFair</a>. If you are entering animals that will also be shown at Mississippi Valley Fair, they must also be entered at: <a href="https://mississippivalleyfair4h.fairentry.com">https://mississippivalleyfair4h.fairentry.com</a>. The animals must be entered into each individual fair.

**STATE FAIR RABBITS:** must be ID'ed in 4hOnline by July 1<sup>st</sup> in order to show at the State Fair.

**COUNTY COMMUNICATIONS & FASHION SHOW:** Both are REQUIRED by July 1<sup>st</sup> at 11:59 p.m.

#### **COUNTY STATIC, PHOTOGRAPHY & HORTICULTURE:**

County Fair Building exhibits, Photography and Horticulture will be entered online through Fair Entry this year! Exhibitors are **REQUIRED** to enter all exhibits in Fair Entry by NOON the day prior to judging for that specific event. If entries are not made by NOON, the day prior \*(See chart below), exhibitors will NOT be allowed to exhibit.

## **FAIR BOOK UPDATES & REMINDERS**

### **LIVESTOCK CHANGES:**

#### GENERAL LIVESTOCK CHANGES:

All Iowa 4-H Members are responsible for following the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship's 2022 Health Requirements for Exhibition of Livestock, Poultry and Birds at a County 4-H/FFA Fair Exhibition which can be found on page 11 of this link: <a href="https://iowaagriculture.gov/sites/default/files/animal-industry/pdf/2022/2022%20Health%20Requirements%20for%20the%20Exhibition%20of%20Livestock%2C%20Poultry%20and%20Birds%20at%20State%20Fair%2C%20District%20Shows%20and%20Exhibitions.pdf</a>

All Species are required to be inspected by the Fair Veterinarian upon arrival.

In addition to these requirements, the Mississippi Valley Fair Board will REQUIRE a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Paper) for ALL SPECIES (including dog, poultry & rabbit) that arrive on the fairgrounds for both open & 4-H/FFA Exhibition. These papers should be submitted to the Fair Veterinarian upon arrival or during the appropriate check-in. Please see the 4-H Fairbook for specific guidelines for each individual species.

#### MARKET BEEF (CARCASS SHOW):

-Entries are due by Friday, JULY 15<sup>th</sup> in Fair Entry. You are required to bring the number of head entered to the show. The show will be pre-entry only, again like last year. Do not enter more animals than you plan to bring. TYSON is requiring us to have exact number to them ahead of the show.

#### **BUCKET CALF & BOTTLE LAMB/KID:**

- Intermediate exhibitors are required to complete an Essay & Budget Sheet in addition to the paperwork from previous years. If you have questions about these requirements, please contact Superintendent. Meghan Bonefas-bonefasmeghan@gmail.com

#### DOG:

- -Dog Show has been moved to the Thursday of fair, August 4, at 4 p.m. in the Variety Tent.
- Handling classes are now called, Showmanship and will be judge based on age of Exhibitor.
- An Agility Class has been added to the fairbook.

#### **MEAT GOAT:**

- -Meat goats will be housed in the Fair Center (cattle barn) during the fair.
- -Care of animals: NO DRENCHING allowed on fairgrounds.
- **-Weight limit:** Meat goats must weigh a minimum of **50 pounds** to qualify for championship honors. All wethers and does will be divided by weight.
- -Coloring agents and paints: There will be no coloring agents or paints used on any meat goat. Exhibitors in violation will not be allowed to show.
- -Shearing: NO SHEARING animals on fairgrounds. ALL Market Animals, INCLUDING Market Does, must be slick shorn.

#### POULTRY:

- **-Bird Flu Update:** Please plan to make entries in the poultry show as normal. We will not know if we will be able to have our show until after the July 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. If you would like to show poultry at the fair, please make entries as usual.
- -All Birds must have a pullorum Typhoid negative test no more than 90 days prior to arrival at fair (including market birds)
- -Exhibitors are responsible for bringing their own sawdust.

#### SHEEP:

-Sheep will be housed in the SMA building during the fair.

#### SWINE:

- -All swine will be vet checked on trailer prior to unloading. Vet check will be from 3-5 pm on Thursday, August 4, 2022. No showing off trailer.
- -All hogs must be on the fairgrounds by 5 p.m. Thursday afternoon.
- The Market Pen of 3 class has been removed from the Swine Show.

Entry tags will be printed from fair entry this year. You will pick up all of your project entry tags during the check-in process for each event and attach them to your projects. Please give yourself a little extra time to prep your projects when you arrive at the fairgrounds, prior to being judged.

#### **GROUP PROJECTS:**

Groups will be judged in the age category of the oldest member. Members may submit projects done as a group. The project will be entered in the appropriate subject matter class and each member must be entered in the project via Fair Entry. All group members will be eligible for ribbons and premiums, but no trophies will be given.

#### RULES

- 1. IMPORTANT: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to read and abide by the General Rules, Regulations, Health Requirements and IAFE Code of Ethics.
- 2. ENTRIES: Entries close July 22.
- 3. All entries must be made upon entry forms provided or online. If not entered online, complete entry form and return it with full payment of all fees.
- 4. No painting hooves allowed in barns or on concrete, violation of this rule will result in disqualification and exhibitor will pay for any damages in result of paint on concrete.
- 5. All meat goats will be weighed.
- 6. Meat goats must weight a minimum of 50 pounds. All wethers and does will be divided by weight.
- 7. Market goats must have kid teeth in normal positions at time of check in any goats having lost any kid teeth will be disqualified.
- 8. There will be no coloring agents or paints used on any meat goats.
- 9. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning stalls and taking used bedding to the designated area.
- 10. Exhibitors must keep their animal and stalls clean and presentable; manure and litter must be put in the appropriate place.
- 11. AGE: This division is open to anyone under the age of 21.
- 12. Goats must have health papers.
- 13. Showing off the trailer is prohibited.
