Health paper updates for 2022 Mississippi Valley Fair

All Iowa 4-H Members are responsible for following the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship's 2022 Health Requirements for Exhibition of Livestock, Poultry and Birds at a County 4-H/FFA Fair Exhibition which can be found on page 11 of this <u>LINK</u>. All Species are required to be inspected by the Fair Veterinarian upon arrival.

In addition to these requirements, the Mississippi Valley Fair Board will **REQUIRE** a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Paper) for **ALL SPECIES (including dog, poultry & rabbit)** that arrive on the fairgrounds for both open & 4-H/FFA Exhibition. These papers should be submitted to the Fair Veterinarian upon arrival or during the appropriate check-in. Please see the 4-H Fairbook for specific guidelines for each individual species.

How do I enter my animal/livestock identification online?

You can view instructions at: Instructions for entering Animal Identification in 4hOnline (market/weigh in animal)

4-H —This will be done through 4hOnline only. No hard copies will be accepted.

FFA — Paper Forms are available from your FFA Advisor or the Extension Office.

The deadline for entering information online will be May 15th by 11:59 p.m. The system will lock at midnight. ALL animals except poultry, rabbits, and first year bucket calves MUST be identified to be eligible to show at county and/or State Fair. The purpose of identifying animals is to list the animals and pertinent information that you might take to the fair.

Tagging Procedures

SWINE, SHEEP & MEAT GOAT EXHIBITORS:

Updates for tagging procedures for 2022:

ALL Swine, Sheep, and Meat Goats need to have a Green USDA tag for the 2022 county and state fairs. Tags will be available at the extension office for purchase.

County Only Swine: All county fair animals must have a green USDA tag and ear notch listed in 4-H online by **May 15th**.

Green Tags will be a \$1.00 each. USDA Taggers are available to borrow and will require a deposit.

State Fair Swine: All state fair animals must have a green 4-H tag, ear notch and DNA punch listed in 4-H online by **May 15th**.

DNA Punches and envelopes must be collected and returned to the office by MAY 13th.

Green Tags will be a \$1.00 each, DNA punches are \$10.00 each (\$11.00 total per head)

USDA & DNA Taggers are available to borrow and will require a deposit. Please call the extension office (563-359-7577) to confirm a tagger is available before you come to get your tags.

County Only Sheep & Meat Goat: All county fair animals must have a green USDA tag listed in 4-H online by May 15th. This does NOT replace the scrapie tag. If your animal requires a scrapie tag, you must list it in 4-H online also.

Green Tags will be a \$1.00 each. USDA Taggers are available to borrow and will require a deposit.

State Fair Sheep & Meat Goat: All state fair animals must attend weigh-in. Animals will receive a green USDA tag and Retinal image taken at weigh-in, along with starting weight.

You will be responsible for entering in your animal's information after weigh-in by **May 15th**. We will hand out help sheets at weigh-in. If your animals are attending weigh-in, you do not need to purchase green tags ahead of time, they will be tagged at the weigh-in.

Please call the extension office (563-359-7577) to let us know you are coming to pick up tags and confirm a tagger is available if needed.

For 2022: All 4-H livestock exhibitors will be required to be YQCA certified for county and State Fair exhibition for the following: Beef, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep and Swine.

YQCA will be offered both online, as well as, in person. It is an annual training that builds on the curriculum each year.

The online training will cost \$12 per member per year.

to login with your 4-H online credentials. Make sure to sign up for the course for your age during the 2021 Calendar Year! (Example: if you turned 12 in 2021, sign up for the 12-year-old class, even if you already turned 13 in 2022)

9-12 Grade Students STEM in Motion

The STEM in Motion program incorporates travel with educational opportunities, allowing youth to interact in a real-world setting and career-oriented pathways. Students will also get the opportunity to gain 1-college credit in science offered through George Mason University for participating and completing coursework upon return.
