DOROTHY KLINDT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY 2023-2024

The Dorothy Klindt Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to an entering freshmen at Iowa State University who is enrolled in the College of Human Sciences. The recipient of this scholarship shall be the individual who best meets the required qualifications, shows a strong work ethic, and a desire to achieve his or her full potential. Financial need is not a criterion.

This scholarship was created in 1990 by Dorothy Klindt's husband and daughters as a permanent remembrance of her life and work. Mrs. Klindt, who died in 1989, was loved and admired by family, friends and the community.

Recipients must meet the following requirements:

- 1) Recipients must live in Cedar, Clinton, Muscatine or Scott County, Iowa, with first preference to female students from rural areas in Scott County
- Above average academic work, demonstrated leadership and involvement in community, school, professional organizations and/or work activities (Evidence of this may include holding office, serving on a committee, and/or receiving honors and awards)

To be considered for this award, students must complete the 2023-24 online scholarship application (OneApp), submit a 2023-24 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and have an offer of admission to Iowa State University by January 3, 2023. Preference is given to students woo demonstrate financial need.

Please advise your seniors of this award and the eligibility requirements.
