- No Late Entries will be accepted. (Exception: Carcass Show due July 14 at 11:59pm)
- No stall or entry fees will be collected.

COUNTY COMMUNICATIONS:

- ENTRY REQUIRED by July 1st at 11:59 p.m

COUNTY KEPPY BUILDING STATIC, PHOTOGRAPHY & HORTICULTURE:

- County Fair Building exhibits, Photography and Horticulture will be entered online through Fair Entry
- Exhibitors are REQUIRED to enter all exhibits in Fair Entry by NOON two days prior to judging for that specific event.
- If entries are not made by NOON, two days prior *(See chart below), exhibitors will NOT be allowed to exhibit.

STATE FAIR RABBITS:

• Must be ID'ed in 4hOnline by July 1st in order to show at the State Fair.

STATE FAIR LIVESTOCK AND HORTICULTURE: Please enter on Fair Entry.

- Horticulture entries are now open until July 1st link to Fair Entry here
- Livestock entries will be open until July 1st at 11:59 p.m link to Fair Entry here
- Late Entries will be accepted with a late fee until July 8 at 11:59 pm
- If you are entering animals that will also be shown at Mississippi Valley Fair, they must also be entered here.
- Animals must be entered into each individual fair.

Health Papers

• All dogs must have their health papers done no more than 30 days prior to the show date (August 2nd). This means that the earliest that they can be done is Monday July 3rd..

Rabies Certificate

• Soraya must have a rabies certificate on file in order to show at the fair. A list of vaccine records will not work for the fair. Bring a hard copy of this to Soraya before fair so you have one less thing to remember show day!



Poultry Plans for County Fair

Note instead of requiring Health Papers for poultry, the fair will have a Fair Vet on duty for two hours during check in Thursday, August 3rd from 8:00am-10:00am.

Pullorum typhoid testing will not be done during the Fair Vet check in. This must be done prior to the fair.

Resources for Youth Well-Being: Social Media Use

Encouraging you to follow the Scott County 4–H Iowa facebook page is a chance to spark discussions about social media use. Talking about the benefits and disadvantages of social media opens lines of communication for any difficulties that may later arise.

The benefits of social media (and the goals of the 4–H Facebook page) include connections to:

- supportive people and positive social networks
- helpful resources
- opportunities for positive experiences
- opportunities for education

Disadvantages of social media use include:

- information from unreliable sources
- distraction from school and healthy activities
- sleep disruption
- lack of privacy
- bullying (also called cyberbullying)
- dating partners or "friends" may exert control through monitoring of location, likes, and follows

Discussions let youth know that their trusted adults are interested in the benefits of social media, are aware of potential downsides, and are available to navigate and provide guidance through both.

What to discuss?

- Identification of reliable sources of information
- Awareness of the digital footprint created with each search, like, and post
- · Awareness of friends being bullied or controlled
- Standing up for friends being bullied or controlled
- Importance of letting a trusted adult know if you or anyone you know is struggling with social media
