Iowa 4-H is excited to begin recruiting for host families for States' 4-H International Exchange Programs!



We are seeking 13 lowa families to host 1 of 12 Japanese youth and 1 Japanese adult chaperone for 3.5 weeks this summer. Based on a complete cultural immersion model, youth are matched with a volunteer lowan family who wants to share their life with an international visitor. This program is designed to focus on daily life in lowa households. Host families do not need to plan special activities or sightseeing for their foreign delegate. Many delegates report that their favorite memories are those that cost nothing or very little.

Host families who would like to host a youth for the 3.5-week summer program should have a child in the home between the ages of 11-17. They are paired with a Japanese child of the same gender and of an age within 3+ years of your child.
