The owner agrees to assume all legal responsibilities as owner of the animal described in this agreement and will not hold the lessee liable for any injury or death loss to the animal, except those due to negligence on the part of the 4-H/FFA member. I also certify that the stipulations concerning the lease have been or will be complied with. I have read and understand this agreement, and will abide by it. I understand that failure to abide by the above rules may result in disqualification of the 4-H'er, and my exclusion from future participation in 4-H activities.

#### **Eligibility Requirements and Rules for Use of Leased Animals**

1. A "Leased" animal is any animal that is not owned by the 4-H'er or his/her immediate family ("Family" definition: father, step-father, mother, step-mother, legal guardian, siblings or step-siblings, grandparents or step-grandparents). Animals owned by distant family-aunts, uncles, cousins or non-relatives are considered leased animals.
2. The **objective** of a leased animal project is to allow 4-H'ers to learn the skills of feeding, management, care, and training of animals. Through this experience they also learn the skills of decision-making, information gathering, communication, responsibility, and self-confidence.
3. A lease program is appropriate when one or more of the following conditions exist:
  - a) Youth do not have the financial ability to purchase an animal
  - b) Youth has an animal but it is unable to be used (i.e. lameness, pregnancy, too young, etc.)
  - c) Youth has an animal but it is of the wrong type for the educational experience the youth wishes to obtain
4. All animals, including leased animals, must be identified in 4-H Online by May 15.
5. Exhibitors must meet all requirements included in 4H 202, including exception to ownership in reference to leased animals. (available online, [http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4hfiles/agriculture/4H202\\_2013.pdf](http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4hfiles/agriculture/4H202_2013.pdf))
6. Animals identified as part of a 4-H project **cannot** also be identified or exhibited as an FFA project or vice versa.
7. The 4-H'er agrees to provide a majority of the management, care, and training for this animal. This includes, but is not limited to, the management, proper feeding, grooming, exercising, health and veterinary expenses, exhibitors' fees, training, boarding, etc.
8. The 4-H'er agrees to make all reasonable efforts to keep the animal in safe stalls, pastures, or corrals, and to care for the animal as if he or she was the legal owner.
9. The 4-H'er is expected to manage and care for this animal at least from May 15 through the end of the exhibiting season (county fair).
10. Sioux County 4-H reserves the right to disqualify leased animal of owners who have previously violated 4-H rules.
11. Potential owners (lessor) should NOT lease animals they want to show on a regular basis during the term of a lease.
12. The leased animal may be exhibited ONLY by the 4-H'er leasing the animal during the time the lease agreement is in effect.
