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## **Meeting Information**

A new chapter begins in Central Iowa around the Nevada region for corn stover harvest. Stover harvesting can impact economic, agronomic, and water quality factors. This meeting will address many of the opportunities and constraints of stover harvesting and discuss how stover harvesting can be effectively managed within corn production. To address different market opportunities, Corn Stover Harvest Workshops have been scheduled on different dates and times.

Participants attending this two-hour workshop will develop a better understanding of the benefits and constraints related to stover harvest based on the research information available to date. Participants will also learn about the Renewable Natural Gas (RNG) program and the associated stover harvest supply chain being implemented by Verbio North America. Attendees will participate in open discussion with presenters and other participants previously involved in stover removal from their farm fields.

This workshop will be of value to crop producers, land owners, crop consultants, agronomists, service providers, media representatives, and others interested in stover harvest and its removal from farm fields. There is no cost to attend this two-hour workshop but pre-registration is required.
