Greetings Tama County 4-H Families!!

It's hard to believe we are already a month into 2022. Before we know it, County Fair will be here!

Here are some reminders about the County Fair:

- Fair Dates are July 11-17, 2022. Clean up is July 9
- All Clover Kid and 4-H members must attend at least three of their club's business meetings by June 1 (June and July meetings do not count) in order to exhibit at the Tama County Fair. If you are finding difficulties in attending your club meetings, contact Jenny immediately to work out a plan with her.
- If you are taking a presentation to the County Fair, you must give that presentation at a club meeting to be eligible for the lowa State Fair.
- ALL ANIMALS must be entered into 4honline by May 15th.
- Camping at the fair—forms will be in the April newsletter and must be in the Extension Office by May 15th or will have a late fee.
- Fair entries for Clover Kids and 4-H members must be in the Tama County Extension Office by 4:30 pm June 15 or postmarked June 15. No late entries accepted.
- 4-12th members who are exhibiting beef, swine, sheep, goat, dairy, poultry and rabbit must be certified in YQCA by June 15.

This is a hands on career immersion event that showcases career opportunities available in Iowa. Some of these may require no post secondary education & some of them could require certificate, designation, two year, four year or advanced degree programs.

This year's career pathways include: manufacturing, healthcare/nursing, law enforcement & emergency services, military, culinary/restaurant & hospitality, agriculture, commercial & residential construction, heavy equipment operators, trucking/driver, automotive, IT & cybersecurity, energy & MORE COMING!

Businesses will be showcasing their business and careers through a hands-on, interactivity activity for students to experience. These could include tools of the trade, virtual reality, and simulators. All attendees go through a brief safety meeting where they'll receive personal protective equipment like eye, hand and ear protection.

This is FREE—all attendees receive a T-shirt, PPE and lunch. Some students may walk away with additional take-home items depending on the hands-on activities they've done.

High school senior scholarship available

Conservation Districts of Iowa (CDI) is partnering with Tama Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) to foster the higher education endeavors of Iowa students interested in conservation and agriculture by offering local, regional and statewide scholarships.

Iowa High School Class of 2022 students, including homeschoolers, pursuing programs of study in any field of conservation or agriculture may apply for the Conservation Scholarship. While many college majors qualify, preference will be given to students pursuing programs of study in conservation. The scholarship must be used for the student's first year of college education.



Three CDI scholarships will be awarded at the state level in the amounts of \$3,000, \$2,000 and \$1,000. Six \$500 regional awards will also be awarded.

In addition to the CDI scholarships, Tama SWCD is offering one \$1,000 scholarship to a Tama County applicant. The Tama SWCD scholarship recipient will be chosen locally. Tama County residents completing the CDI scholarship application are automatically considered for this local scholarship.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS DUE March 1

Are you an Iowa 4-H'er planning to attend college? The Iowa 4-H Foundation knows it's not easy to finance a college education, and we know that many Iowa 4-H'ers can use help achieving their educational goals. Consider applying for an Iowa 4-H Scholarship, funded by donors through the Iowa 4-H Foundation.

Designed to encourage lowa 4-H members to continue their education beyond high school, our current scholarship program offers over **90** scholarships worth more than **\$100,000**. Applications are available on-line and are **due before or on March 1, 2022**. Only one application form is needed for all lowa 4-H scholar-ships. Eligible lowa 4-H youth may apply for more than one scholarship, however, only one scholarship per individual will be awarded per academic year.

Each month we will highlight project areas that you might be interested in but didn't know much about!



Do you have an animal you want to keep healthy? Are you interested in a career helping lots of animals stay healthy? The veterinary science project area enables you to explore and learn more about animal health in your home, club and community.

Ideas for this project: Explore the basic needs of health and safety for various animals; learn how veterinarians and owners work together to keep animals healthy; investigate the many careers in animal science and veterinary science, explore bio-security and make an animal health management plan for animals; learn about proper hoof care; give an educational presentation on the types of injections and how to vaccinate animals; make and sell homemade healthy pet treats.



Leaders influence and support others in a positive manner for a shared goal. Leaders aren't just elected. You can be a leader of committees, small groups and teams, Learning about yourself and how you work with others is a vital part of developing leadership skills.

Ideas for this project: Job shadow or interview a local leader; plan and present a fun club activity; work with members to establish ground rules for club meetings; run for office in your club; develop and implement a school survey of student's teachers and administrators; give a presentation on parliamentary procedure or other decision-making methods; plan for your club's next service project; mentor a younger member with record-keeping and preparing exhibits for fair.


