In May—all 4-H families received a fair book with a fair entry form for each member.


**If you did not receive your book, reach out to your leader.

County Extension and Outreach Office by 4:30 p.m. on

Wednesday, June 15th or postmarked June 15th.

This is the form to sign up for the classes you want to enter at the fair. Only these entries will be allowed at the fair. Make sure to make an entry for each animal and each exhibit. Example—you are bringing 2 photos...enter the photo class two times and pay \$2.00.

Need help deciding what class to enter? Think about your goal! Contact the office if you need help. Extension Office is open 8 am to 4:30 pm Monday thru Friday.

Fair Challenge "Recycle, Rescue, Restore or Reuse



Iowa 4-H STEM in Motion

New York | Boston | June 6-10, 2023

STEM in Motion is a program geared towards 9-12th grade students interested in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math.



This opportunity incorporates **travel** with **educational opportunities** to interact in a real-world setting and career-oriented pathways. We will be visiting different places to see how the world works through the eyes of STEM.

Youth will be participating in hands-on activities and experiencing once in a life-time opportunities.

Brooklyn Bridge and Statue of Liberty- Walk across the iconic NYC bridge while taking in breathtaking views of the Manhattan skyline. Consider the engineering and mechanical feats required to build Lady Liberty in the late 19th century.

Intrepid Air and Space—Visit the renowned museum aboard an aircraft carrier docked in New York City. Explore the ship and its many artifacts and interactive exhibits include the space shuttle Enterprise and a decommissioned submarine.

MIT Robotics & Coding- Designed and operated by MIT PhD graduates, students will collaborate on both hardware and software design by building circuitry and writing software together. They will create, program and fly a helicopter that they build in small groups.

READ RULES!!!!


Beginning on page 68 are the non-livestock rules. Make sure to read those and all rules specific to your class.

FOOD and NUTRTION RULES

Copy Right

It is the responsibility of the 4-H member to be aware of copyright/trademark regulations when developing their fair exhibits. Pinterest is very popular—but the original contributor and site must be cited. Go back as far as you can to cite the original contributor.

More information on how to receive permission and find a Pinterest source is found under fair information: http://www.extension.iastate.edu/tama/4h. Anyone not following copyright rules, will be disqualified at the Tama County Fair! Be prepared and careful!



Safety in Exhibits

As you work on your exhibits, think safety. Remember safety glasses, ear protection and more. Keep your work area clean while you are baking. Show your hair tied up and washing your hands!

Show that in your write ups by using pictures and telling your story.

Do you think there is safety to think about in photography? YES!

- * Railroad tracks are considered unsafe and trespassing! Railroad tracks are private property.
- * Do not take pictures while on or near a railroad track.
- * If a judge determines that an exhibit is not safe, then it can be disqualified and not allowed to be put on public display.
