

Only animals identified in 4honline will be allowed on the Tama County Fairgrounds. (Animals attended a weigh-in? New this year-the member is required to put the information into 4honline.)

Make sure to complete all required questions and to click the submit button!

Pictures are NOT required this year. (Except for horses exhibiting at State Fair)

If you are both a 4-H and FFA member and are identifying animals FFA—<u>DO NOT put your animals in 4honline!</u> Contact your FFA advisor for a paper form.

*a registration number * calfhood vaccination number * 4-H tag.

If you are in need of a 4-H tag, you can pick one up at the Extension Office. Cost is \$1.25.





DEADLINE

Required for 4-H and FFA members who will be exhibiting at the Tama County Fair and State Fair.

Swine, Beef, Dairy, Sheep, Goat, poultry, rabbit (includes all 4-H bottle animals)

This training must be completed by June 15, 2021.



Fair Books and Entries

Fair books have been printed and will be handed out at your May Club meetings.



Fair Entry Forms



Included in the fair book is the fair entry form. Every member (Clover Kids and 4-H) must complete this form to make your fair entries. (If you are in 4-H and FFA—you must complete a form for 4-H entries and another for FFA entries).

Fee is \$1.00 per entry. (Clover Kids—there is no fee).

***Remember: Every entry must be written down and paid for (example—you are going to bring 4 photos—you must write that down 4 times and pay \$4.00)

Where it says Fair Book Number—that means the class number.

The Entry Form is also on our website.

Make sure to double check you have a class for each animal you plan to bring to the fair. If there is not a class listed, that animal will not be allowed to enter the fair.

All Fair Entries are due June 15, 2021

Ways to Turn in your Entry Forms.....

- 1) Mail your entry forms to: Tama County Extension Office, 203 West High Street, PO Box 308, Toledo, Iowa
- **2) Drop off your entry forms at the office.** Extension Office is open Monday thru Friday, 8 am to 4:30 pm. **NEW THIS YEAR—During May and June, the Extension Office will be open until 6 pm on Wednesday.** Great time to get questions answered and help with your entries, fair write ups, sign up for camps, and more!
- 3) Drop off your entry forms at the office after hours in the drop box. USE CAUTION: If you use the drop box and rain is in the forecast, put your forms in a plastic bag. The drop box does get wet.

Make your checks payable to: Tama County Livestock & Fair Association No late entries will be allowed.

Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF)

9-12th grade 4-H members—register now for this virtual opportunity to participate in National 4-H Council's premier leadership and citizenship program for high school age students. While it typically takes place in Washington, DC, this year it will be held in a virtual format.

Elevating youth voice and strategies for being effective change agents are the focus of the entire five-week virtual CWF experience. Sessions will take place once a week, for 5 weeks, beginning Sunday, June 20, 2021, for a few hours each of those days.

The fee to participate is \$250 per delegate which will include a swag bag and participant materials. Youth are encouraged to apply for financial assistance through the Iowa 4-H Foundation.

Registration is open in 4honline with a deadline of June 1.





Elevating youth voice and strategies for being effective change agents are the focus of the entire five-week virtual Citizenship Washington Focus experience. Sessions will take place once a week, for 5 weeks, beginning Sunday, June 20, 2021. Open to 9-12th graders.

Each week will explore new topics in these areas:

Week 1: June 20 - 6-9 PM ET - Empathy, Active Listening &

Week 2: June 27 - 6-9 PM ET - Exploring National Topics

Week 3: June 5 - 6-9 PM ET - A Local Focus

Week 4: July 11 - 6-9 PM ET - Change Making Strategies

Week 5: July 18 - 6-9 PM ET- Action Plan Symposium
