## **Breeding Heifers**

Breeding heifers are required to have a tattoo PLUS one other form of ID.

This other form of ID can be 1) 4-H tag, 2) Registration number OR 3) Calfhood vaccination number.

If you need help with a tattoo or need a 4-H tag, contact the Extension Office. Cost for tags are \$2.00.



If you are exhibiting the heifer as registered, the registration number must be entered into 4honline by May 15.

A County Fair Queen must reside in the county she represents or an adjoining county if the majority of her activities are in the county she represents. If a fair represents more than one county, the winning contestant must reside in one of the

Each contestant must be an active member of at least one service organization in her community such as a church group, Girl Scouts, 4-H, etc. (Eligibility is not limited to 4-H membership.)

Open to all females 16-21 years of age.

You can mail or drop off the registration/money to the Tama County Extension Office.



Online entries will be required for all exhibitors (Clover Kid, 4-H and FFA).

The deadline for online entries is 11:59 pm June 15.

Late entries will not be allowed.

#### Payment is not accepted online. Cash/Check will be accepted until July 1.

Instructions for the entry process are posted on our website. If you do not have internet access or need assistance with the entry process, the Tama County Extension Office is open 8 am to 4:30 pm Monday-Friday to help.

In addition, we will be traveling the county to help with setting up accounts, completing fair entries, answering any questions and colleting payment.

## 2023 Iowa 4-H Youth Conference June 27-June 29 Iowa State University in Ames, IA

Every June, approximately 500 teenagers converge on the campus of Iowa State University for 3 days full of speakers, workshops, mixers, dances, a banquet, and service-learning activities. If you have a specific interest in animal science, you might want to look into becoming part of the Animal Science Round-Up track You get to identify what areas you are interested in for workshops so that each day you get to explore a new topic of learning. You can select multiple project areas if you want to get more variety of learning topics while you're on campus.

If you've completed 8th grade, you're eligible to attend. You don't even have to be in 4-H to attend this conference!

You will get to experience campus life and meet new people from across the state! You will be having fun while learning by doing, dancing the nights away, and serving the community. You will get to learn new things to take back to your community and school, and in the process you might even discover something new about yourself! There are opportunities for you to share your talents and meet new people through educational workshops, teambuilding activities, and a talent show.
