



STATIC EXHIBITS “How To...”

A guide to preparing your projects for the fair

- Static exhibits (projects) are open to all 4-H’ers and Clover Kids.
- There are 6 main project areas: **Animals**, **Creative Arts**, **Ag & Natural Resources**, **Family and Consumer Sciences**, **Personal Development**, and **Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics**
- Consult your 4-H fairbook for a listing of these project areas and the rules for each area. No matter what your project is that you create, we can find a project area that it will fit under!
- Each static exhibit that you enter requires a write-up. Clover Kids **DO NOT** need a write up, but can complete one if they want to.
- The write up is judged as well as the project aka, the write-up is important!
- The write up consists of answering 3 questions
 - What did you plan to learn or do?
 - What steps did you take to learn or do this?
 - What were the most important things you learned?
- It is a good idea to include pictures with your write up.
- Your judging experience for each project will take anywhere from 3-10 minutes depending on the judge, you and your project.
- You must have completed the 5th grade to be selected for State Fair.
- Ribbons and premium will be awarded and special awards will be given to those selected by the judges.
- 4-Hers **MUST** wear their green 4-H shirt while being judged. Clover Kids are encouraged to wear their Clover Kid shirts.
- It is important to cite your sources and follow copyright law when creating your projects!
