## Cat, Hobby Animals, & Pet Project



### Details:

4-Hers MUST attend one meeting in order to exhibit at the fair in the cat/pet/hobby animal show.

You can bring your cat/pet to the last meeting at the fairgrounds, but it needs to be contained in a cage or traveling container. This helps them get prepared for coming to the fair. Your cat/pet needs to stay in the cage during the meeting unless it is used during your presentation.

A presentation by each 4-H member is encouraged during the year. Presentation topics are completely up to each 4-Her and can be about his/her animal or more detailed like a disease.

The junior leaders request that 4-Hers bring donations for Almost Home during each meeting. Examples: newspapers, old towels, bleach, collars, pet food, paper towels, cat litter.

### Additional Information:

Looking for another fair exhibit opportunity? Not only can you exhibit your cat/pet during the show, but you can also create a static exhibit in the Animal Science class that is judged on Tuesday, July 11th. Below is the class description.

- Animal Science: Any exhibit (excluding an animal itself) which is an outgrowth of a small or large animal project or program including beef, cats, dairy, goat, dog, horse, pets, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine. Ownership of an animal is not required for entry of this class. Exhibit topics might include, but are not limited to, selection, feeding, financial management, waste management, use of records, health care, housing, or career opportunities.
