USDA Provides Greater Protection for Fruit, Vegetable & Other Specialty Crops

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12, 2014 – Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today announced that greater protection is now available from the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program NAP) for crops that traditionally have been ineligible for federal crop insurance. The new options, created by the 2014 Farm Bill, provide greater coverage for losses when natural disasters affect specialty crops such as vegetables, fruits, mushrooms, floriculture, ornamental nursery, aquaculture, turf grass, ginseng, honey, syrup, and energy crops.

"These new protections will help ensure that farm families growing crops for food, fiber or livestock consumption will be better able to withstand losses due to natural disasters," said Vilsack. "For years, commodity crop farmers have had the ability to purchase insurance to keep their crops protected, and it only makes sense that fruit and vegetable, and other specialty crop growers, should be able to purchase similar levels of protection. Ensuring these farmers can adequately protect themselves from factors beyond their control is also critical for consumers who enjoy these products and for communities whose economies depend on them."

Previously, the program offered coverage at 55 percent of the average market price for crop losses that exceed 50 percent of expected production. Producers can now choose higher levels (buy-up option) of coverage, up to 65 percent of their expected production at 100 percent of the average market price......

Several crops whose application for coverage closing date has already passed. Those include (but are not limited to): aquaculture, Christmas trees, turf sod, orchards, vineyards, fruit-bearing bushes, strawberries, honey and maple sap. FSA is offering a retroactive application for coverage to producers of these crops for the buy-up option only. The application for closing date for these crops is Wednesday, January 14, 2015



Goals of the Midwest Grape & Wine Industry Institute

The Midwest Grape & Wine Industry Institute at Iowa State University was approved by the Iowa Board of Regents in September 2006. The Institute is the first of its kind in Iowa.

The formation of the Institute is a result of the state's evolving grape & wine industry. Dr. Murli Dharmadhikari, ISU Extension enologist who was hired in 2005, was named director of the Institute.

Goals of the Institute include:

- Conduct research to evaluate cold-hardy grape varieties that can thrive in the Midwest
- Conduct enology (the science of wine & wine making) research
- Develop a wine quality award program that will provide wine buyers a quality-assurance stamp of approval
- Establish an outreach program to the industry by training a team of specialists
- Partner with community colleges to develop job training programs specific to growing grapes and making wine


