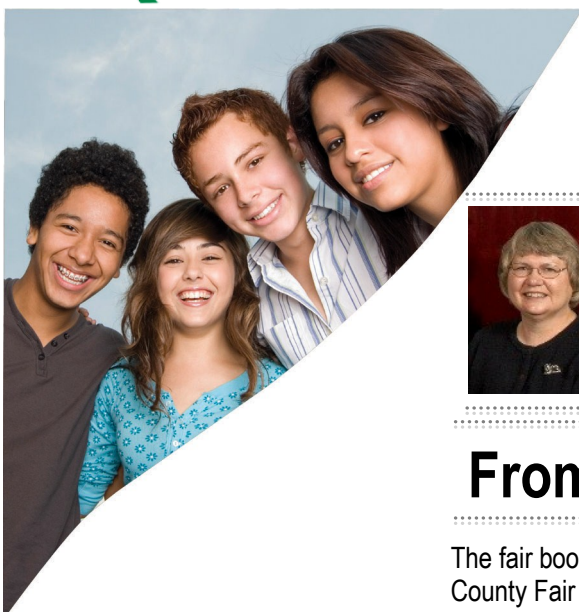
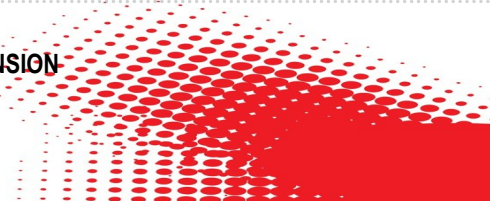

The fair books are now available at the Woodbury Extension office and at the Woodbury County Fair office in Merville. Each family receives one book. Be sure to read through the sections that you are interested in exhibiting projects. If you want some extra help on preparing for fair, there will be a Pre Fair Event at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds on Wednesday, July 11. See the enclosed flyer. Please take advantage of this event.

Enclosed is the 4-H Building Entry Form. You will need to fill this form out with the projects you will be exhibiting in the 4-H Building. Bring the form with you on judging day. You will also need to fill out the goals for each of your projects. The goal questions can be found on page 68 of the fair book, rule #4, or read the article in this issue of the *4-H Scene*. Each project will also need a hang tag. **Forms will not be available at the fair!**

In the June 4-H Scene were the following forms – all are due on Monday, July 16, by 4:30 p.m.

If you miss the deadline you will not be able to exhibit those projects at the fair.

Judging to be held Tuesday, July 17 in Sergeant Bluff
County judging for Fashion Revue (outfit that is sewn), Clothing Selection (purchased outfit) and the \$15 Challenge (a purchased "used" outfit from a thrift shop, garage sale, etc. and not from a bargain rack at a store) will be held on Tuesday, July 17 from 5:30 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. at the United Methodist Church in Sergeant Bluff. A report form for 4-H'ers in 4 -8 grades is included in the June newsletter or forms can be requested from the Woodbury County Extension office. Junior (4-6 grades) and Intermediate 4-H'ers (7 and 8 grades) can also download the County Junior/Intermediate form at: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/woodbury/page/4-h-info-woodbury-county-fair>

Look at the bottom of that page for county report form for Junior/Intermediates or on the Woodbury 4-H website.

You will need to go under each event: Clothing Selection, Fashion Revue and/or \$15 Challenge. Senior members may type into that form. This site also lists the evaluation form that 4-H judges will be using to evaluate your outfit.

4-H County Council Applications due July 16

Do you enjoy working with other teens, doing community service and planning events for 4-H members? Then you will be interested in applying for the 4-H County Council. If you are going to be in 10th, 11th or 12th grade this fall and have been involved in 4-H for 2 years you already meet some of the requirements. The interview committee will look at your leadership, your interest in the 4-H program and if you are able to meet once a month and help at 4-H activities. Eligible 4-H'ers can request an application for the 2012-2013 Woodbury County 4-H Council from the Woodbury County Extension office or you can request a form by e-mail from Lujean Faber at: faber@iastate.edu.

2012 Clay County District Fair Entries due to Woodbury County Extension on July 16

The Clay County 4-H/FFA District shows will be open to all eligible 4-H/FFA members. FFA participants must be a member of an Iowa FFA chapter and be in good standing with the local and state associations. The Clay county Fair begins Saturday, September 8 and ends Sunday, September 16. All 4-H entries must be submitted through the local county extension. FFA members must submit through their FFA Chapter/Advisor.

There still are Individual livestock cards (it was reported in

error about in the June 2012 4-H Scene that there would not be cards). 4-H members will still need to fill out cards and the summary form. Cards, forms and all fees are due to the Woodbury County Extension office on Monday, July 16 by 4:30 p.m.

Clay County Communications entries are due during the county fair after county fair judging of those events. The Clay County District entry form and cards are available at the Woodbury County Extension office and the form will list entry fees.

Livestock and horse entries are due Friday, August 10 in the Woodbury Extension office. Horse exhibitors must be 12 years old by January 1, 2012. Other exhibitors must be 10

2012 Bobier Studio Photography 4-H Fundraiser

Woodbury County 4-H will again team up with Bobier Studio for a photography fundraiser. Last year \$500 was donated back to 4-H from the overall sales made during the 2011 Woodbury County Fair. Andrea Zenor and her staff will be at the fair taking action shots of 4-H'ers while they exhibit their 4-H projects, take pictures of champion and reserve champion exhibitors, and offer open photo sessions for all 4-H'ers to have the opportunity to get their picture taken.

You can then order the pictures you choose in the size and finish you would like. The pictures can either be ordered from Bobier Studio's booth, which will be in the Varied Industries building or from their online gallery at

www.bobierstudio.photorelect.com. Bobier Studio is generously donating a percentage of the proceeds to Woodbury County 4-H. The money raised from this fundraiser is used to

put on 4-H workshops for Woodbury County 4-H members. Workshops that we have had in the past include: Cake & Cookie decorating class, bling it on workshop, painting class & a scrapbook workshop. These workshops help our members learn new skills for projects that can be taken to the fair.

This year to insure that pictures are taken of your child, there will be "event forms" that can be picked up at either the 4-H office or the Bobier Studio booth in the varied industry building the week of fair. These forms will have the 4-H show and child information to help the staff of Bobier know what you would like pictures of.

Make sure you stop by Bobier Studio's booth to view pictures and participate in the photography fundraiser!

Recording your Animal's Health

Now that most of the 4-H members have their animal projects. It is important that you start keeping records of their health and the medicines that you give your animals. 4-H members may go online at: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/StateFair/livestock.htm> and

look for "Drug Affidavits" on that site. There are forms for: Beef, Horse, Meat Goats, Sheep and Swine. The forms are required for State Fair and especially for Swine for county fair.

A sheep shearer will be available on the morning of July 21 from 7:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m. at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds. Families who would like to have their lambs clipped, please contact Laura Johnson (712) 276-2157 ext. 21 or laurajoh@iastate.edu to set up a time to have your lambs clipped. The sheep shearer will charge \$3.00 per lamb.

Please note new rule: Lambs must be slick sheared by weigh-in of fair. NO SHEARING CAN BE DONE AT THE FAIR! Lambs must weigh 90 lbs. by fair weigh-in to be considered for rate of gain class.

What the 4-H Judge looks for when judging your fair exhibit

Check out this website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects> this site list the 4-H Project Hot Sheets and most important the Exhibit Tip Sheets. The site for the tip sheets is: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects/tipsheets.htm>. The exhibit tip sheets tell you exactly what is needed for county fair judging. Most important are the 3 questions that you need to answer for each of your exhibits.

1) **What did you plan to learn or do? (What was your exhibit goal(s)?)**

2) **What steps did you take to learn or do this?** Explain what you wanted to do so it is easily understood. The judge wants to know and understand the steps you used to make your exhibit.

3) **What were the most important things you learned?**

You can design your own form or if you would like you can request a goal form from the Extension office or check out the fair forms at: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/woodbury/kidsteens.htm> - you will need a goal form for each exhibit.

Exhibits in Home Improvement, Visual Arts, Clothing, Sewing, Fashion Review, Clothing Selection and \$15 Dollar Challenge will need design elements and/or art principles.

4-H Pie Contest August 4

The 4-H Pie Contest is our county 4-H fundraiser. Each club is expected to bake a pie for the pie contest that will be held on Saturday, August 4. All pies will be sold at the pie Auction. 4-H Clubs can decide who in the club will bake the pie. It could be a club pie baking contest, drawing a name out of a hat or a 4-H'er who volunteers to bake the pie. Each 4-H club pie must be a two-crust pie. Pie filling can be fresh fruit, homemade canned or canned fruit in a disposable pie tin. No egg custard or uncooked dairy products. The recipe must be Included.

Practice baking your pie –comments from judges in the past have been that pie crusts are soggy on the bottom (it takes a little higher temperature for the first few minutes when

baking a pie in an aluminum pie tin). Use fresh shortening or lard, have the correct amount of thickener for your fruit (look over your recipe before baking your pie) and seal the pie crust. We want the best baked pies for our pie auction. See the county fair book for more information on the 4-H Pie Contest.

The money from the pie sale is used for:

Medical insurance for each 4-H member and leader, 4-H recognition and awards, State 4-H Conference, leader workshops, Washington DC Citizenship trip, county fair, 4-H events – like the Halloween Party, 4-H Holiday, Shooting Sports, financial assistance for county and other district events.

This year’s theme for the Woodbury County 4-H Foundation Silent Auction at the Woodbury County Fair is “Anything Goes.” Items could be something made, purchased, or donated from a business.

Examples may include, but are not limited to, gift certificates to a business, quilts, purses, pillows, shelves, whatever! If you think it may be too large for the booth, please contact Adrienne Jansen at (712) 276-2157 to make accommodations for the item.

Please check-in items at the 4-H Exhibit Building on project judging day Monday, July 30.

One half of the money received from the sale of each club’s item will be returned to that 4-H club, and the other half will be donated to the Woodbury County 4-H Foundation.

Silent auction items will be on display for bidding in the 4-H Exhibit Building during the Woodbury County Fair.

State Fair Selection

4-H’ers whose exhibits are eligible for state fair may want to prepare labels ahead of time for your exhibit(s). State fair exhibits require labels on all items in your display. You will need enough labels for every page of your write up and goal sheet (maybe set the computer to do that as a footer) and for every item in your display. Some exhibits need up to 50 or more labels.

The preprinted labels will come in handy when you get your project ready for state fair because those exhibits need to be in the Extension office the Monday after fair on August 6, by NOON. This leaves very little time to prepare and clean up your exhibit for state fair. You cannot prepare or put labels on

your exhibit until after release on Sunday, August 5, 4:00 p.m.

The label needs to include:

Woodbury County
Class number (look in fair book – it’s the same number you use for county fair)
Your first and last name

We are looking for someone to take exhibits to the Iowa State Fair on Tuesday, August 7. Your mileage will be paid. Jim Thomas will be able to pick up the exhibits on Monday, August 20.

4-H Communications Information

The form is due Monday, July 16. Poster Art will be judged on Monday, July 30. Use 4-H Building Entry form. Posters are judged in Personal Development.

Pride of Iowa

Pride of Iowa is pre-judged on Tuesday, July 24, 4:30 p.m. at United Methodist Church, Merville.

Presented during the fair on either August 2 or 3.

4-H’ers in grades 4 – 9 can give a presentation without speaking and promote Iowa products.

Educational Presentations

Presentations pre-judged on Tuesday, July 24, 4:30 p.m. at United Methodist Church, Merville.

Presented during the fair on either August 2 or 3. 4-H’er gives a formal presentation in front of an audience from a topic that is an outgrowth of the 4-H’er’s knowledge.

Working Exhibit

Working Exhibits are judged during the fair on Thursday August 2. 4-H’ers communicates directly with a small audience by demonstrating or teaching a skill.

Share-the Fun

Judged during the fair on August 3.

Individuals or groups can perform dances, skits, songs, stunts or short one act plays. Presentations must not exceed 8 minutes.

Extemporaneous Speaking

Judged during the fair on August 3.

4-H members who are in grades 9 – 12 will choose a topic “from the hat” and will have 30 minutes to prepare a 4-6 minute speech. 4-H Families and anyone interested in watching are invited to attend the pre-judging on Tuesday, July 24.

Hang Tags

Hang Tags are needed to identify your project for county fair. The tag helps to identify who the project belongs to and what class the project is entered in.

This tag helps the 4-H fair superintendents and 4-H judges know whose project it is when judging the exhibit for county fair and selection for state fair.

Hang tags must be requested from your 4-H leader. None will be available at the fair. It is your responsibility to make sure you have those attached BEFORE you come to the fair. For your club booth number see the Club Booth Assignments Flyer in this issue of the *4-H Scene*.

Design Elements and Art Principles

County Fair 4-H Forms – Due July 16

In the June *4-H Scene* the Livestock/Animal Entry form was sent out along with the Horse/Rabbit Entry form. Those forms are due Monday, July 16 to the Woodbury County Extension office. Also enclosed in the June *4-H Scene* was the 4-H Communications form, due Monday, July 16.

4-H Exhibitor Pass

4-H members must purchase a youth exhibitor pass for \$2. The passes are available from the Woodbury County Fair in Merville, or check with your 4-H Leader. Some of the 4-H leaders will pick them up for their members or you can purchase them from the Woodbury County Extension office.

The Woodbury County Fair Board required all 4-H members and FFA students to have a youth exhibitor pass to exhibit at the county fair.

Mandatory State Fair Meeting

A Mandatory State Fair Meeting will be held on Wednesday, August 1, at 4:30 p.m. at Flathers Hall.

Labeling will be explained and other helpful tips to get your exhibit ready for state fair. All 4-H'ers who have projects selected for state fair (includes all champion and reserve champion exhibits) are required to attend the Mandatory State Fair meeting.

“County Only” Horticulture exhibitors are not required to attend as those are county only classes – but we would like you to come for pictures.

If you are not present at the mandatory meeting, the alternate (reserve champion which are rank 1, 2 3...) exhibit will be able to have their exhibit go to the state fair. 4-H'ers who have completed 5-12 grades are eligible for state fair.

Pictures for Champion and Reserve will be taken after the Mandatory State Fair Meeting.

Copyright Question

Q. Can you offer general guidelines for 4-H members to follow regarding exhibits and copyright?

A. Each case is different, and it is very hard to offer recommendations that will apply to all exhibits. However, use the following guidelines as a start:

- 1) **Create something original**
- 2) **If it's not yours, obtain written permission**
- 3) **Give proper credit, even when you have permission**

Photography – What you need for fair

You will need to fill out information about your photography exhibits.

That information can be found at:

<http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects/tipsheets.htm>

For all exhibits, be prepared to explain:

- **What did you plan to learn or do? (What was your exhibit goal(s)?)**
- **What steps did you take to learn or do this?**

Explain what you wanted to do so it is easily understood. The judge wants to know and understand the steps you used to create your final photograph.

- **What were the most important things you learned?**

Start with a well defined photography goal:

- **Does the photography goal relate specifically to the photography exhibit entered?**

- **Does the goal use photography terminology?**

Example: To place my photo's point of interest by using rule of thirds.

Include the following information in your response to the question:

“What steps did you take to learn or do this?”

Camera Information: Digital or Film
Camera Brand and Model: Pixel count

- **Do you have additional lenses? Yes/No**
- **Was the lens you used to take this photo the one that came with the camera? Yes/No**
If no, what lens did you use?
- **If your photo is enlarged, who enlarged it? Where was it printed?**
- **Were any changes made to the original photo to create the final exhibit? Yes/No**

(Include such things as cropping, color enhancement, size of exhibit, removal of red eyes, etc.)

If Yes, list the changes and tell why the decisions were made to make the changes.

- **Who determined what changes, if any, were to be made to the photograph?**
- **Who designed and selected the mounting or matting?**
- **Who actually did the mounting of matting?**
