## From the desk of Lujan Faber...

### Livestock and Animals need to be identified by MAY 15!

Important information if you plan to exhibit animals at the Woodbury County Fair, Iowa State Fair, Clay County Fair and Ak-Sar-Ben.

**What to do:**

Animals need to be entered and identified into 4-H Online by 11:59 pm on May 15.

Go to: <https://iowa.4honline.com/>

This is the same location that you enrolled in 4-H. Do NOT create a new profile.

You also will need to be enrolled in 4-H and your enrollment fee paid before you can identify your animals into 4h Online. There have been several 4-H'ers who created a new profile...those take more work to correct and the Extension Staff hope to have those corrected by May 1.

**What is needed for Identification:**

Animal that you entered in 4-H online will ask for either tags or tattoo depending on species. Horses will need 4 pictures downloaded. You will need to have that information handy when you enter your animal's ID information into 4-H Online and on the paper forms. If you entered animals in 4-H Online last year, they will still be listed. Those animals are horses, dairy cattle, dogs, pets and dairy goats...but that is only if you entered them in 4-H Online last year.

**No Computer:**

The paper Identification form will NOT be in the 4-H Scene. If you need paper forms please contact the Woodbury County Extension office BEFORE May 15. Form will be for individual species...tell us what animals you plan to exhibit so that the correct forms can be given to you. You can also get your own paper forms at: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects/livestock> - just select the animal(s) you plan to exhibit and that form will be on that animal's webpage.

**Animals that need to be identified are:**

Breeding Heifers, Feeder Calf, Cow/Calf, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Horse, Dog, Swine and Llamas. Woodbury County 4-H does not require 4-H'ers to identify Poultry, Rabbit or Small Pets for county fair, but they will be required for State Fair and Clay County Fair. Market livestock which includes Market Steers, Market Heifers, Market Sheep and Market Meat Goats and Pig-of-Merit Swine that attended their county weigh in do not have to be entered.

It is the 4-H'ers and their family's responsibility to identify their animals by May 15!

Every June, over 1000 teenagers converge on the campus of Iowa State University for three days full of speakers, workshops, mixers, dances, a banquet, and community service activities. You don't even have to be a 4-H member to attend! The Woodbury 4-H County Council has made it their goal to get teens to this event. Youth and adult chaperones MUST register in 4-H Online to attend the conference...this year there are no paper forms, go to: <https://iowa.4honline.com/>. You must update your health form that is already in 4-H Online. Please make your check payable to Iowa State University but your payment MUST come to the Woodbury Extension Office.

Cost is \$150 and includes T-shirt. There will be an extra \$30 to stay in dorms on June 24. Youth who are enrolled in Woodbury County 4-H will have their bus transportation paid for, but it will be on a first come first serve basis. Adult chaperones are also needed for the Woodbury delegation, both male and female. All costs will be paid by Woodbury 4-H for chaperones to attend. ## County Fair Requirements

**To Exhibit at the County Fair you must be enrolled and your enrollment fee paid by May 15**

4-H'ers who plan to exhibit at the Woodbury County Fair must be enrolled in 4-H Online by May 15. If you do not have the internet, you may request paper forms, but those forms must be in by May 15. You must also have your enrollment fee in the office by May 15. That fee is \$30 for 4-H'ers who were enrolled in 4-H last year and \$20 for brand new 4-H'ers. Clover Kids must also be enrolled by May 15 – there is no enrollment fee for K-3 youth.

## State Fair, Clay County & AK-SAR-BEN Livestock | Enter on 4honline

**4-H members must identify their animals by May 15 in 4-H Online <https://iowa.4honline.com/> by 11:59 p.m.**

Those animals include: dogs, swine, breeding heifers (includes feeder calf), horse, rabbit (By July 1 for State Fair and May 1 for Clay County), Poultry (Clay county only – by May 1), Dairy Cattle and Dairy Goats.

**Please Note:** You can only identify so many animals in each specie – for the list of animals please go to the 4-H Livestock Homepage at <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects/livestock> and download a copy of the 4-H 202 publication.

Animals that come to a tagging and weigh-in (market beef, market sheep, pigs and meat goats) will be entered by Extension staff, but will need to be verified by the 4-H member.

## NEW in 2013| County Livestock ID's now on 4honline

4-H members must identify their livestock animal projects in 4-H Online for the Woodbury County Fair. This will replace the May 15 paper form that was turned in. **There will NOT be any forms in the 4-H Scene**, forms may be requested for families who do not have internet access by calling our office at 712-726-2157, by emailing Laura, [laurajoh@iastate](mailto:laurajoh@iastate) or Lujean, [lujean@iastate.edu](mailto:lujean@iastate.edu)

**Animals that must be Identified in 4-H Online are:** Breeding Heifers, Feeder Calf, Cow/Calf, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Horse, Dog, Swine and Llamas. Woodbury County 4-H does not require 4-H'ers to identify Poultry, Rabbit or Small Pets for county fair. Market livestock which includes Market Steers, Market Heifers, Market Sheep and Pig-of-Merit Swine that attended their county weigh in do not have to be entered.

**Animals must be in 4-H Online by 11:59 p.m. on May 15.** 4-H'ers who still want to fill out paper ID forms can also request those forms BEFORE May 15, OR you can download your own forms by going to the Iowa 4-H Livestock page at: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/projects/livestock> - just click on one of the animals listed and an ID form can be found on that animal webpage (except for llamas – those 4-H'ers will have to ID in 4-H Online or request a county ID form). Cow/Calf and Feeder Calf can use the Beef Breeding ID form or go into 4-H Online.

**IT IS THE 4-H'ER'S AND THEIR FAMILY'S RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE ANIMALS ARE IDENTIFIED CORRECTLY AND ENTERED BY MAY 15.**

## FSQA Testing Dates

### 4-H'ers exhibiting at County Fair or State Fair

June 11th 10:00 a.m.– 12:00 p.m. Woodbury County Extension Office

June 11th 6:00 p.m.— 7:00 p.m. Woodbury County Extension Office

### 4-H'ers exhibiting at County Fair Only

July 9th 10:00 a.m.—12:00 p.m. Woodbury County Extension Office

July 9th 6:00 p.m.— 7:00 p.m. Woodbury County Extension Office

4-H'ers in grades 7-12 who exhibit animals at the Fair MUST take the FSQA test to be eligible for the Woodbury County Fair. You may come anytime between the times listed, testing usually takes 20-30 minutes. Youth are able to take the test 3 times at one setting to pass it.

To check your FSQA status, please visit your 4Honline account to see when your child's status expires.

### Sheep: 8:00 a.m.-11:00 a.m. Woodbury County Fairgrounds

All market, commercial ewe and ram lambs must be ear tagged and weighed. For more information contact Sheep Superintendents: Penny Yaremko (712) 372-4722; Holly Petersen (712) 365-4528; Kathy Petersen (712) 259-1428.

4-H'ers who plans to attend the Iowa state fair or AK-SAR-BEN must have their market and commercial animals verified by a retinal scan, tagged and weighed between 8:00 a.m. –9:30 a.m. County tags cost \$1.00 each. State Fair & AK-SAR-BEN Exhibits are \$5.00 each. Families will need to take DNA sample for AK-SAR-BEN animals.

### Goats: 9:00 a.m.—12:00 p.m. Woodbury County Fairgrounds

All goats must be either tagged or tattooed for county fair & state fair. 4-H'ers who exhibit meat goats at the county fair must have their animals tagged. For more information contact Goat Superintendents: Maggie Locke (712) 574-1203; Jen Ankerstjerne (712) 333-0771

4-H'ers who plans to attend the Iowa state fair or AK-SAR-BEN must have their market and commercial animals verified by a retinal scan, tagged and weighed between 8:00 a.m. – 9:30 a.m. County tags cost \$1.00 each. State Fair & AK-SAR-BEN Exhibits are \$5.00 each Families will need to take DNA sample for AK-SAR-BEN animals.

## Feeder Calves Need an Official 4-H Tag

4-H'ers planning to exhibit feeder calves at the Woodbury County Fair, Clay County Fair and Ak-Sar-Ben – must be tagged on or before Tuesday, May 15. **Tags must be the official Iowa 4-H tag.** Feeder calves must be identified on or before May 15 in 4-H Online. Tags are available at the Woodbury County Extension office and cost \$1.00 per tag.

4-H'ers planning to exhibit at Ak-Sar-Ben must also collect a DNA sample – those samples are due to the Woodbury County Extension office before June 1. DNA envelopes are available at the Woodbury County Extension office; cost per envelope is \$5. The calf for Ak-Sar-Ben must have been identified by May 15 in 4-H online at: <https://iowa.4honline.com>. For those families who do not have internet access, please request a paper ID form from the Woodbury County Extension Office. Paper ID forms are also due on May 15.

## Individual Swine Tags

4-H members will need to purchase Woodbury County Fair tags for their individual pig projects. Tags are \$1.00 and can be purchased at the Woodbury County Extension Office. Pigs will also need to be identified by May 15 in 4-H online at: <https://iowa.4honline.com>. For those families who do not have internet access, please request a paper ID form from the Woodbury County Extension Office. Paper ID forms are also due on May 15.

## Rabbit Tattooing | June 25

4-H'ers exhibiting rabbits at the Woodbury County Fair must have their rabbits tattooed. For those without tattoo equipment, a tattooing date is set for Monday, June 25 from 6 p.m. – 8 p.m. at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds. Contact 4-H Rabbit Superintendents Teresa Lewis (712) 384-2420 or Tammy Brady (712) 258-2021 if you have questions. Tattoos are \$1.00 each.

## Pullorum Testing | June 30

All poultry exhibited at county fair must come from U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean or equivalent flocks (this means the location where your poultry is housed is NPIP certified (National Poultry Improvement Plan) or have a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days of public exhibition and the test must have been performed by an authorized tester. The majority of 4-H members who exhibit poultry will not be NPIP certified and will have to have their birds tested if they plan to exhibit at county fair. The county testing date will be held on Sunday, June 30, 4:30 p.m.— 7:00 p.m. at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds. Cost is 50 cents per bird (except doves and pigeons).

4-H members may have another Iowa certified tester test their birds, which needs to be done within 90 days of the county fair. Each participant had four or five projects to display at the City Fair, which was held on the last afternoon of the camp. The Midtown staff would like to thank the three county council 4-Hers and the adult volunteer, Diane Ralston for serving as conference judges for the camp's City Fair. The third through fifth graders had the opportunity to experience conference judging of their projects. The younger children visited with the judges about their projects. Everyone received ribbons and were so proud of their achievements. The fair was well attended by the children's families. Some of our campers are 4-H members that are now excited about bringing their projects to the Woodbury County Fair.

During the month of April and into May, the four AmeriCorps workers have completed a service learning project focused on neighbor beautification. ***Master Gardener Tip for May: Mulch around newly planted trees & shrubs***
