4-H Livestock Show Requirements

In this issue of the 4-H Scene is page 1 and 2 of the livestock requirements for County, State and Interstate shows. The lowa 4-H Office wants 4-H'ers to read the information and become familiar with the requirements. 4-H members can now go into 4-H Online and start to identify animals: iowa.4honline.com

All livestock and animals must be identified by May 15. They include Feeder Calf, Dairy Cattle, Breeding Beef, Dairy Goat, Dog, Llamas and Horse. Market Steers & Heifers, Sheep, Swine and Meat Goats that come to an official county tagging and weigh-in will be entered by extension staff and then the family must verify the information entered. Pets, poultry and rabbits are not required to be identified for county fair; 4-H'ers may enter them into 4-H Online. Rabbits for state fair MUST be identified in 4-H Online.

Use 4-H Online | To Identify your animals | Enroll in 4-H

4-H members who have livestock and animal projects will need to go into 4-H Online to identify their animals. 4-H'ers must identify their animals by 11:59 p.m. on Tuesday, May 15 to be eligible to exhibit at the Woodbury County Fair, Iowa State Fair, Clay County Fair and AK-SAR-BEN livestock show. All 4-H'ers must be enrolled by May 15 to exhibit at the Woodbury County Fair.

New Families joining have until May 15 to enroll (if they plan to exhibit at the county fair). The enrollment fee for new 4-H'ers stays at \$10 until May 1. On May 2 the enrollment goes goes up to \$35. Before new families can go into 4-H Online, we need to set up a profile first. Please give us your:

This information can be given to your 4-H leader or emailed to Lujean at faber@iastate.edu. When the profile is created, you will be sent a personal email on how to enroll in 4-H Online.

It's not too late for 4-H'ers who were in 4-H last year to enroll in 4-H. Your fee will be \$35.

FSQA (Food Safety Quality Assurance) REQUIRED TO EXHIBIT AT FAIR

This is a required *workshop* for 4-H members in 4th - 6th grades who will be exhibiting Beef (market, breeding, cow/calf and feeder calf), Dairy Cattle, Goats (Dairy & Market), Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep & Swine. You MUST attend this workshop to exhibit at the Woodbury County Fair and/or the lowa State Fair.

4-H'ers in 4th, 5th, or 6th grades <u>must</u> attend any of the following workshops. **You must call to reserve your spot.** Limit to 40 youth per workshop. 4-H'ers must have completed trainings or tested out before July 1.
