Clay County Fair, Sept 8-16 | 4-H Fair Entries Due July 15

Livestock entries and fees are due in the Woodbury Extension office on July 15; since that is a Sunday this year, forms and fees must be into the Woodbury County Extension office by Monday, July 16 @ 4:30 p.m.

4-H'ers will need to fill out entry cards to enter their livestock projects for the Clay County Fair. For more information on Clay County for 4-H go to website: <http://www.extension.iastate.edu/clay/info/fairinformation.htm>

For late entries after July 15 (July 16 by 4:30 p.m.), there will be an extra fee of \$25 to Clay County 4-H.

The Clay County Fair book is posted at the above website. 2018 4-H Clay County changes can also be seen at the above website. It is the responsibility of each 4-H'er exhibiting at the Clay County Fair to read and know the rules for the Clay County Fair.

Iowa State Fair 4-H Entry for Livestock, Dog & Horticulture

State Fair Entries is an online process for 4-H Livestock, Dog and Horticulture. 4-H'ers will not need to go through the county extensions office. Fair entry will open on June 1. This entry process must be done for all Breeding Heifers, Market Beef, Sheep, Swine, Rabbit, Dog, Dairy, Poultry, Horse, Goat, and Horticulture. 4-H'ers will enter and pay in an online process. The browsers you should use are: Google Chrome, Firefox and Safari.

Please make sure your email is up to date and that you know your 4-H Online password. Entries will be due July 1 by 11:59 p.m.

- Click "Sign in with 4-H Online" Enter your family email and password - if you forgot you password DO NOT SELECT I forgot my password. You will need to go into your 4-H Online account at: <http://iowa.4honline.com> and select I forgot my password for your new password.

FSQA Workshop and Testing| Last Chance if you want to exhibit at Fair

This is your last chance to test out or for 4th-6th graders to attend a workshop if you plan to show Cattle (market, breeding, cow/calf, feeder calf), Goats (dairy, meat and fancy), Dairy Cattle, Rabbit, Poultry, Sheep and Swine at the Woodbury County Fair, Iowa State fair or Clay County Fair.

Last testing site in Woodbury County at the Woodbury County Extension Office

- ◆ June 5 & 12 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. (come at any time during those hours, but please give yourself time to complete the test).

4-H'ers in grades 7th - 12th grades must take the FSQA test. You only need to take the test once as a 7th - 9th grader and then again as a 10th – 12th grader. Most 4-H'ers test out as a 7th grader and again as a 10th grader. If you need to know if you need to take the test, please check in 4-H Online under your family profile.

LAST FSQA WORKSHOP for 4-H'ers who are in 4th - 6th grades will be held on June 12, from 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. at the Woodbury County Extension Office. 4-H'ers must attend the FSQA Workshop if they plan to exhibit any of the animals listed above at the county fair. Please call 712-276-2157 to reserve your spot!

Register for Iowa Youth Conference 2018 | June 1 or by June 10 includes late fee

The 2018 Iowa Youth Conference will be held on June 26-28 on the campus of Iowa State University in Ames, Iowa. Any youth (not just 4-H'ers) who have completed 8th grade this spring to 12th graders can attend. Cost to attend is \$180 plus \$30 to stay the night before at the dorms (total of \$210). Please make your check payable to Woodbury County Extension. You must be registered by 11:59 p.m. on June 1; on June 2 the price goes up to \$200. On June 11 all registrations are closed.

4-H members will need to register through ISU Registration Services and payment is sent to the Woodbury County Extension Office. Cost is \$180 plus \$30 if you ride the bus or come the night before.

The bus will leave the afternoon of Monday, June 25. There is no cost for Woodbury County 4-H members to ride the bus, but it is on a first come first serve basis. Youth not in 4-H will need to pay approx. \$50 for the bus. If you want to ride the bus, please contact the Woodbury County Extension office to reserve your spot – please call 712-276-2157 and indicate if you will be getting on the bus at Sioux City or Merville. Adults are needed to chaperone the Woodbury delegation – there is no cost for adults.

There will be a mandatory meeting for all **new** Woodbury participants who attend the Iowa State Conference on Tuesday, June 12, 5:30 p.m. at the Woodbury County Extension Office. At the meeting you will meet other delegates, find out what to bring, bus schedule and expectations. State Council members will be present at the meeting to help answer your questions. Parents are encouraged to attend.

Iowa 4-H Animal Care and Management Disclosure Statement (Drug Affidavit)

Required for Market Beef, Market Goat, Sheep and Swine projects that will be shown at County Fair.

4-H'ers who will be bringing market beef, market goats, sheep and swine to county fair check-in must fill out an Iowa 4-H Animal Care and Management Disclosure Statement. This is a state 4-H rule that 4-H'ers must follow on the county level when showing animals at county fair.

Bring the form(s) with you on Fair Entry Night, July 31. **DO NOT** send it to the Extension Office; it must come with your animals on fair entry night.

Pullorum Testing for Poultry | June 10 from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m.

All poultry exhibited at county fair must come from U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean or equivalent flocks (this means the location where your poultry is housed is NPIP certified (National Poultry Improvement Plan) or have a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days of public exhibition and the test must have been performed by an authorized tester. The majority of 4-H members who exhibit poultry will not be NPIP certified and will have to have their birds tested if they plan to exhibit at county fair. The county testing date will be held on Sunday, June 10, 6:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. at the Woodbury County Fairgrounds. There is no cost for the testing; the fee is picked up by the proceeds of the chicken dinner held during the fair.

4-H members may have another Iowa certified tester test their birds, which needs to be done within 90 days of the county fair. For a list of testers, contact the Iowa Poultry Assoc. at: <http://www.iowapoultry.com/>.

Only official paperwork from a tester will be accepted for entry at the Woodbury County Fair. You must ask for a certificate when you purchase your birds from a Pullorum-typhoid free flock.

What is Copyright? Important Information for County Fair

Every year at the fair there are 4-H exhibits that cannot be displayed because they have not followed copyright rules. Your responsibility as a 4-H'er is to make sure that you are not using other's people's work without their permission before putting the item on public display and earning premium money from the work. Before you copy/draw/recreate a painting, cartoon character, photograph, company logo, or other piece of work for the fair, you need to ask the original creator for permission. Information on copyright and a copy of a copyright permission letter can be found in the Iowa State Fair 4-H Handbook located at <https://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/iowa-state-fair-4-h-handbook> - near the bottom of that page. There is also information about Pinterest and how to search the site to credit the creator.

Design Elements: Line, Shape, color, texture and space

Art Principles: Rhythm, Proportion, Emphasis, Balance and Unity
