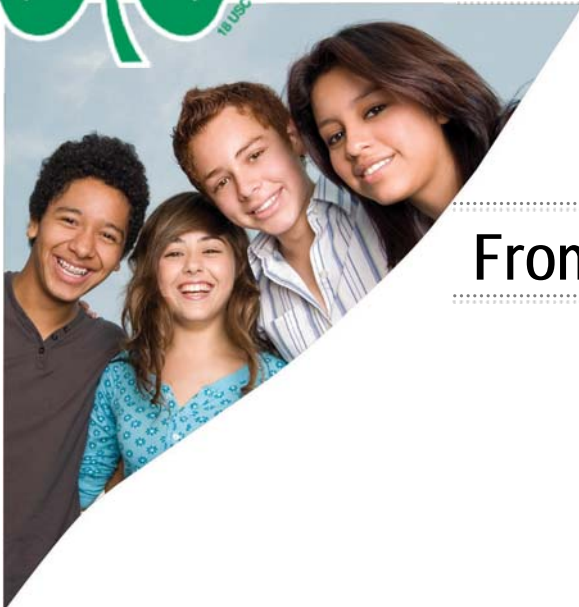

Enrollment in 4-H Online is open! Enrollment Fee \$5 Bucks

4-H'ers and ALL Volunteers enrolled in 4-H Last Year

4-H families and 4-H volunteers who are already in 4-H Online may start to enroll for the new 4-H year on September 1. Any family that has a new email must first send that new information to our office, otherwise they won't be able to get into 4-H Online.

- Go to: <https://iowa.4honline.com>
- Select I have a profile.
- Enter your family email (if you want to use a different email, let the office know and they can change it before you go online).
- Then put in your password...if you forgot your password, select "I forgot my password" and a password will be sent to you via email...shouldn't take very long.
- When you get to the "Family Screen", select the edit button next to the person's name.
- You will fill out or update the personal information, the code of conduct and the medical information.
- When done, select "Submit Enrollment."

Cost to join 4-H in Woodbury County is \$5. Thank you to New Coop for \$15 of the fee. We are currently working on donations for the \$10. Without this generous donation, the fee would be \$30 per member.

New Families and New Volunteers

New 4-H families and 4-H volunteers (adults that do not already have a profile) will need to provide the following information:

- Family Name (First and Last Name):
- Address and/or post office address
- Town, State and Zip Code
- Phone Number
- Family Email – If a family does not have an email, you will be sent paperwork to fill out.

This information may be emailed to Lujean at faber@iastate.edu or may be sent to the Woodbury County Extension. 4-H Leaders can also send the information to Lujean. After their profile is created, Lujean will send the family an email or call and let them know that they can fill out the other information on their child. If the family doesn't have internet, they can still fill out all the paperwork: 4-H Enrollment Form, Medical Form and Code of Conduct.

4-H Enrollment Fee

4-H Fee: The 4-H fee is \$5 and must be sent to the extension office by January 15 (for 4-H members in last year). If you plan on participating in any 4-H event, that fee and enrollment information must be in the office BEFORE you can attend. 4-H'ers who were enrolled last year, must pay the \$5 fee by January 15, after that date the fee will be \$30. All new members have until May 15 to enroll and pay the \$5 fee if they plan to exhibit at county fair. There is no enrollment fee for Clover Kids in grades Kindergarten - 3rd Grade.

NO "PENDING" after 30 days: When you enroll in 4-H Online, you must pay your enrollment fee within 30 days. After that time you will be put into inactive status and will have to re-enroll and pay the \$30 fee.

This is a 4-H committee responsible for 4-H fair rules and guidelines, Hall of Fame nominations, and 4-H Fair Superintendent positions. The committee meets 3-4 times a year.

4-H Fair Superintendents Positions Open for 2017 Fair

The Woodbury County Extension Council had decided many years ago that 4-H Fair Superintendents would serve a 3 year term. The 4-H & Fair Committee was given this task and with the 4-H personnel committee will be selecting 4-H fair superintendents in late November/early December. If you are interested and would like to be considered, please contact Lujean at the Woodbury County Extension. There are openings in livestock and the 4-H building.

The following superintendent's positions are open:

4-H Building: Ag& Natural Resources, Clothing & Sewing, Communications, Consumer Judging, Food & Nutrition, Home Improvement, Horticulture, Personal Development, Photography, and Visual Arts

Livestock/Small Animal: All Around Showmanship, Cattle, Dog, Goats/Llamas, Herdsmanship, Horse, Poultry, Rabbit, Horse, Sheep and Swine.

4-H fair superintendents are responsible for reviewing 4-H fair rules and guidelines, attending a couple of meetings throughout the year, setting up livestock weigh-in, plan workshops/training and be able to attend the Woodbury County Fair. Term limit is three years.

The Woodbury County Fair will be tentatively held August 2 – 6, 2017 (4-H building judging is July 31, livestock entry is August 1).

Citizenship Washington Focus - 4-H Trip to Washington D.C. in June 2017

Looking for an experience of a lifetime? Look no further than the Citizenship Washington Focus trip where you as a 9th-12th grader can travel by charter bus to visit Washington D.C. and the National 4-H Center. Experience leadership and citizenship on a higher level with this epic opportunity on June 16-24, 2017.

Details are still being worked on, a few of the trip highlights include the Arlington National Cemetery, Capitol Hill, Mount Vernon and the Smithsonian Museums. Youth will also meet with the Iowa Congressional and Senate delegations to discuss legislative issues. Besides tours and workshops, 4-H'ers will have time for socializing and meeting new friends!

Cost of the trip is \$1,570. This includes lodging, transportation, tour site admissions and most meals. Registration and a \$510 deposit will be required to secure a spot. Woodbury County 4-H members will receive a scholarship of approximately \$150 that will be given right before they leave for Washington D.C. Space is limited. Adults are also needed to chaperone the trip. Chaperones' registration fee is \$75. It will be split into two payments of \$392.50. Payments will be due February 1, and April 1, 2017. If a Woodbury County adult is selected for the trip, they will receive a \$200 scholarship. For more information on chaperones, see the same above website. There will be a pre-trip Orientation in January 2017.
