


- Open to all Wright County Youth.

County Fair and State Fair Swine Tags are Now Available

- 1. Stop by the extension office Monday-Friday 8:00 am— 4:00 pm (We are closed April 7) to pick up tags. If you need to borrow our tagger please call ahead to make sure one is available. 515-532-3453. Please return all taggers within 24 hours so someone else can use them. Each DNA tag is \$8.00 and 4-H USDA tags are \$1.00. We can not except credit cards at this time. Please bring exact change or check.
- 2. Tag your swine. Each animal going to the state fair also requires a DNA collection tag and one 4-H or USDA tag. DNA collection tag uses a different tagger then the 4-H tags.
- 3. State fair DNA collection tags need to be returned to the extension office in the white envelope provided. Signatures are required on each white envelope. The extension office will mail the white DNA envelopes to the State Fair. Return white envelopes with DNA collector by May 13.
- 4. Enter your swine ID's in 4-H online before 11:59 pm May 15.
- 5. Enter your classes in FairEntry by June 15.



Youth in grades 4- 12, and FFA members up to 21 years old producing and/or showing pigs, beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, rabbits, and poultry MUST BE YQCA CERTIFIED to show your animal a producing and/or showing pigs, beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, rabbits, and poultry MUST BE YQCA CERTIFIED to show your animal at any fair.

Cortification lasts for any year

Certification lasts for one year.

Youth have three options to get certification.

Host Families Still Needed for States' 4-H Exchange Japanese Youth

The <u>States' 4-H Exchange International Program</u> seeks 8 more lowa families to host a Japanese exchange student or adult chaperone for 3.5 weeks this summer. This program is designed to focus on daily life in lowa households. Families who would like to host a youth should have a child in the home between the ages of 11-17. Entry Now Open for Market Broilers

Entry is now open for Market Broilers for the lowa State Fair. Entries are due in FairEntry by May 1. Payment must be postmarked on or before May 1. Exhibitors must purchase 50 birds at a cost of \$93.50. For families sharing the 50 birds, each 4-H member must make a class entry for the Market Broiler division, but only one 4-H member should indicate the bird order. Birds will be shipped from the hatchery contracted by the lowa State Fair directly to the 4-H'ers on June 26. Participation is limited to the first 100 youth. Animal Costume Class

(Dairy, Beef, Rabbits, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Poultry, Pets)

Animal Costume Class will add to the last class after each species show. (Dairy, Beef, Rabbits, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Poultry, Pets)

Exhibitor & animals must comply with general rules for health requirements on pages 9-10 in fair book.

- 1. No entry fee & no premiums will be awarded in costume classes.
- 2. All entries must be entered in 4-H online & FairEntry by the deadlines.
- 3. This class is for exhibitors to have fun while showing the bond between the animal & exhibitor.
- 4. Each Costume Class will begin 15 minutes after the conclusion of each species show. Costume class is only for animals that are already entered in another class.
- 5. Entries in this class will be judged on these main points:

Acceptance of Costume

- a. The animal accepts the costume (no stomping, shaking or balking).
- b. The animal walks/moves normally with costume. (no sidestepping, hopping).

Unified Theme

- a. The exhibitor & animal are in costume.
- b. The costumes create a unified theme.
- c. The theme is easily identifiable.

Construction of Costume

- a. Fits animal well not falling off.
- b. Is safe for the animal to wear & move around.
- c. Allows animal & exhibitor to maintain visual acuity.

Clover Kid Challenge Classes

What is a challenge class? Each year a new theme is chosen in food nutrition and photography project areas and 4-H members and clover kids enter the class using the same theme.

Example: if the food and nutrition challenge class is chocolate chip cookies, each youth would use

the same provided recipe. You might be wondering how they will be different, check out this years challenge classes on display at the fair in the 4-H exhibit building to see if you can tell the difference.

2023 Clover Kids Photo Challenge Class

Clover Kids grab your favorite camera to use and snap a picture outside. Make sure to print your picture as a 4x6 and enter your exhibit in FairEntry under Clover Kids

Microwave Rice Krispie Treats

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons butter or 3 tablespoons margarine
- 40 large marshmallows (or 4 cups mini marshmallows)
- 6 cups Rice Krispies

Directions

- 1. In a large microwave safe bowl, heat butter & marshmallows at HIGH for 3 minutes, stirring after 2 minutes. Stir until smooth.
- 2. Add Rice Krispies cereal. Stir until coated.
- 3. Press mixture into a 13"x9" pan coated with cooking spray. Cut into squares when cool.




