What to do BEFORE, DURING and AFTER reading.

BEFORE READING

Preview the book. Look at the pictures. What is the book about? What will happen?

Introduce one or two new words, and explain what they mean. Read the title, the author's name, and the illustrator's name.

DURING READING

Point out the new words you introduced before you started reading. Ask your child to read words or

Ask questions about the book. See examples on the other side of this bookmark.

AFTER READING

phrases that repeat.

Talk about the story and how the book connects to your life. Reread! Repetition is one of the best ways to learn.

Do an activity related to the book.

Animal Science Roundup

Animal Science Round-Up will be held in conjunction with Iowa 4-H Youth Conference. June 27-29. Youth in grades 8-12 that have an interest in cattle, dogs, horses, poultry, sheep, or swine are encouraged to attend. Youth will learn about health, nutrition, behavior, genetics, and reproduction. Each animal project area is limited to the first 20 who register via 4HOnline. Registration opens March 15. New this year: youth do not need to apply or be approved! Herbert Hoover Uncommon Student Award

The Herbert Hoover Uncommon Student Award is a \$10,000 scholarship program for lowa high school juniors. The award, honors Herbert Hoover, an lowa native and the thirty-first President of the US, identifies approximately 15 lowa high school juniors who propose and then accomplish projects of their design. The projects should demonstrate the values Hoover exemplified. Each of the finalists will receive a \$1,500 cash award at the completion of the program. Four of those could earn an additional \$10,000 scholarship each, for a total of \$11,500! Application deadline is March 15, 2023. For more information and to submit an application, have students visit the website.

Equine Extravaganza

Equine Extravaganza provides opportunities for all youth in grades 4-12 to demonstrate their knowledge of equine-related subject matter in a competitive setting where attitudes of friendliness and fairness prevail. Depending on the event, youth can participate both as an individual and as part of a team. Participatory Events – Creative Writing, Digital Story, Clothes-Crafts-Woodworking, Drawing, Painting, Poster, Model Horse, Photography, Scrapbooking are for grades 3-12.Hippology, Quiz Bowl, Horse Judging, Public Speaking and Presentations Contests are for grades 4-12.

Certification lasts for one year.

- Test out option (youth ages 12, 15, and 19)

Static Challenge Classes

What is a challenge class? Youth can choice a special challenge class to participate in. The two challenge areas are food and nutrition and photography, each year a new theme is chosen and 4-H members enter the class using the same theme.

Example: 2022s Photography Challenge class was the 4-H Clover, members entered different pictures they took theat represented the clover. The challenge class entries still sit down with the judge, but also work together to learn how to judge the photograph.

New this year judges choice award will be awarded for one entry in photography and one in food and nutrition challenge classes.

Below are the themes for the 2023 Wright County Fair Challenge classes!

2023 4-H Food and Nutrition Challenge Class

Libby's Classic Pumpkin Bread

Ingredients

1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour

1/3 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 cup vegetable oil

1 1/2 cups granulated sugar

1/3 cup water

1 1/2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 large eggs

1 cup LIBBY'S® 100% Pure Pumpkin

Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 350° F. Spray a 10-inch loaf pan with baking spray. Set aside.

In a medium bowl, stir together flour, spices, baking soda, baking powder and salt; set aside. In a large bowl, combine vegetable oil, eggs and sugar. Stir in pumpkin. Then add flour mixture alternating with the water in two installments.

Pour bread mixture into prepared pan. Bake for 60-70 minutes or until bread is firm and cooked through.

4-H Awardrobe Clothing County Event

New this year Judging will take place during Static Judging day on July 11 from 9:00 am-1pm. 4-H members must check in before 12:00 pm.

What is a Awadrobe Clothing event?

4-H Members enter a class that fits with their goal of a piece of clothing or outfit. (classes listed below) When 4-H members meet with a judge they are also modeling their clothing item or items. During judging the judge will ask questions about the goal of the design, how much it cost or what was changed. Event participants will have a changing area in the static building to model their outfits for the judge.

After members have completed their clothing judging they should continue to get the rest of their exhibits judged. 4-H members will then be asked to bring their outfits to Share the fun on Friday July 14 for a fashion show and ribbon results. Only Senior level 4-H members may qualify for state fair.

Event Classes:

- **Fashion Revue:** The purpose of this class is to encourage the construction of a personal garment or outfit.
- Clothing Selection: The purpose of this class is to select and/or purchase an outfit that represents the 4-H member's goal or intended use for the selected outfit.
- ★ The \$20 Challenge: (formally the \$15 challenge) This class is designed to expand the 4-H member's shopping experience to shopping venues emphasizing recycling, reducing, and reusing. Outfits must be purchased at a garage sale, consignment store, thrift store, secondhand store, or similar place.
- Innovative Design: New in 2023 The purpose of this class is to encourage creativity and out-of-the-box thinking when creating an outfit.
- Clothing Changed or Modified (county only) a garment (constructed or ready-made) that shows major changes to make it more useful. Examples include recycling a garment or design changes to a garment.

Watch for the fair book for the official rules and guidelines. 4-12 graders may participate. Entry deadline is June 15 in FairEntry.

These classes are a fun experience! Consider trying something new!
